



What?

- All plant and equipment used on J & E Hall sites must be safe for use and comply with appropriate legislation and standards
- Any cleaning or maintenance activities are conducted with the equipment fully isolated and any moving parts at a complete rest
- Ensure that the activity has been suitably risk assessed
- Inspect Pipes and Couplings for weeping, splits and deterioration
- Follow safe procedures for connecting and disconnecting pipes and couplings
- All work areas are suitably lit
- Operators must be properly trained and competent to use the equipment
- Where protective devices form an integral part of the equipment, ensure they work effectively
- All PPE must be worn and should be suitable for its intended purpose
- Ensure emergency procedures are in place and suitable communications are available
- Hydraulics are serviced and maintained at the correct intervals

Why?

- Faulty or damaged hydraulics can cause equipment failure
- Hydraulic leaks can cause slips
- Moving parts of machinery can cause serious injury



Do



- ✓ Check equipment is fit for purpose
- ✓ Inspect equipment prior to use
- ✓ Read manufacturer's instructions
- ✓ Use plant for its intended purpose
- ✓ Make sure that guards are in place and secured
- ✓ Isolate equipment before conducting any checks and ensure any moving parts have come to a complete stop
- ✓ Switch off engines when not in use
- ✓ Report any Health & Safety concerns to your manager

Don't



- ✗ Use unless you know how to operate
- ✗ Use defective or damaged tools
- ✗ Bypass or remove safety devices
- ✗ Wear loose clothing near moving machinery
- ✗ Make temporary repairs using tape or other materials
- ✗ Operate faulty equipment
